Catherine majored in social work at Georgetown University, ending up in Seattle. One

day she heard about a five-month course in basic trade skills for women, including an automotive component. Catherine was hooked. While taking the class, she decided that one day she would own her own shop, creating the kind of place women felt comfortable bringing their cars.

Over the next decade she spent time rebuilding transmissions, working for a dealership and two independent repair shops, and taking another sixmonth automotive course. She also took business classes at night from Georgia State University and learned about small business management from her mom, an art gallery owner. She even found time to be a nanny to her sister's children.

Catherine believes she's onto something, judging from the number of customers who drive great distances to patronize her shop. She employs three technicians, two of whom have Master Automotive Service Excellence certification. The busy premises are patrolled by Maggie, a black lab/border collie mix who'll entertain you with her tennis ball while you wait.
